Purpose of report

Medium:

1 To update the Committee on the the National Collecting Scheme for Scotland.

Main report

- 2. At the meeting of 29 August 2003, the Committee agreed to the City Art Centre's participation in the National Collecting Scheme for Scotland. The City Art Centre is one of six museums and galleries in Scotland working in partnership with the Contemporary Art Society to purchase challenging contemporary visual and applied art for Scottish collections.
- 3. At that meeting, it was agreed that reports on the works purchased would be brought to the Committee at regular intervals. The purchase of the first work under the scheme was reported to the Committee on 28 June 2008. This was an installation and documentary entitled *Nothank* by Graham Fagen. Four further works have now been purchased:

- 4. A number of other works are current in the process of being purchased. These include two sets of photographs by Christine Borland, a painting and a drawing by Carol Rhodes, a film by Rosalind Nashashibi, a painting by Toby Patterson and an installation by Rose Frain. Grant aid has been applied for all the works. It has been offered for some, and a decision is pending on a final work.
- 5. All the works purchased through the scheme will be shown in an exhibition entitled *Living in the Modern World* which will be shown in the City Art Centre over the winter period.
- 6. It is anticipated that a final report on the completion of the initial three year phase of the National Collection Scheme for Scotland will be presented to the next meeting of the Committee.
