1 Minute of Meeting

The minute of meeting of the Consultative Committee with Parents of 11 May 2010 was approved as a correct record subject to Item 5 being renumbered as Item 4 on the Minute.

2 CCWP – Future Arrangements

M Rosendale spoke to the circulated report which took into account all of the views expressed to date about the future of the CCwP. The report attempted to set out some proposed changes to the CCwP's structure and operation and how these might be taken forward.

He went on to outline the proposals in the report for immediate changes to the membership, structure and operation of the CCwP.

During discussion on the various options presented in the report, it was suggested that CCwP meetings should include time set aside for informal discussion between members. In addition, that an opportunity be given to members to forward Items for discussion to officials closer to the meeting date.

Decisions

- (ii) Agreed to hold 5 CCwP business meetings;
- (iii) Agreed to hold 2 Revenue Budget meetings to which all Parent Council Chairs would attend;

- (iv) Agreed to hold a further additional CCwP meeting to which all Parent Council Chairs would be invited to discuss a topic of interest;
- (v) Agreed Item 3.6 of the report on the establishment of a working group to carry out a review of the Department's current strategy e.g. resources, Curriculum for Excellence, Additional Support for Learning and report back to the CCwP before the end of the current academic session; and
- (vi) Agreed that an Item be included at the end of the CCwP Agenda to discuss "Parent Council Raised Issues" ie AOB

3 Update by Convener and Director

In addition to the Director's Report which had been circulated, there was tabled a further update by the Convener.

Members agreed that it was helpful to receive an update from the Director in advance of the meeting. It was noted that a report on "Community Access to Schools" would be going to the Education, Children and Families Committee on Tuesday 9 November 2010.

4 Early Years Service (including Primary 1 deferrals)

A McLean, Neighbourhood Manager (South), Early Years and Childcare, gave a presentation on the "Early Years Strategy". She covered the following topics;

- Pre-school Education Summary
- Deferred entry to P1 and comparison with other Local Authorities
- Approximate breakdown of 2010/11 figures
- The Way Forward
- What the research base tells about delaying school entry
- Scottish research

- Why delay school entry; and
- Overall conclusions

The Committee was informed that the City of Edinburgh Council had the highest number of deferrals in Scotland. H Gorton, Educational Psychologist provided

further background information on this, and explained that the reasons for deferral were being looked at, questioned and examined.

Due to lack of research and information available in the United Kingdom on why parents deferred sending their child to primary school and the effects this had on a child later in their life, she had personally undertaken research on this topic.

5 Positive Destinations

K Prophet, Head of Quality and Curriculum, gave a presentation on "CfE/16+Learning Choices – The Senior Phase". She covered the following items;
