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Executive Summary

Council Grants to Third Parties 2014/15 – Proposals for Expenditure

Summary

This report seeks approval for a package of grant investment to support third sector, cultural and sporting bodies across the city.

In light of the decision of the Communities and Neighbourhoods Committee on 11 February 2014, relating to the Review of Council Grants to Third Parties, this will be the final report to this committee seeking approval for grant expenditure.

Recommendations

- 1. Approve the proposals contained in the report; and
- 2. Note the potential change in future grant management arrangements as a result of the Review of Council Grants to Third Parties.

Measures of success

- 95% of funding agreement reviews occur within 10 days of the agreed date.
- A minimum of 90% of recipients are satisfied with the support received from their lead department.
- The performance data collected from grant recipients relating to user satisfaction, financial leverage, volunteer activity and levels of proposed target achievement continue to show high levels of attainment.

Financial impact

All proposals are contained within service area revenue budgets for 2014/15.

Proposals identify options for grant expenditure based upon affordability.

Equalities impact

The Council's funding of third parties through grant aid significantly contributes to the delivery of the Equality Act 2010 duties to eliminate unlawful discrimination, harassment and victimisation, advance equality, and foster good relations. There is also a significant contribution to human rights articles relating to fair trial, freedom of expression, private and family life and prohibition of discrimination. Any proposals which result in disinvestment are subject to an appropriate equalities impact assessment where necessary.

Sustainability impact

Proposals contribute to the city's sustainable development objectives, in particular the advancement of vibrant flourishing communities, social and economic well-being and an efficient and effectively managed city. A number of supported organisations provide for a number of sustainable purposes, in the form of waste, recycling awareness and education. All organisations are requested to minimise their respective impact on the environment and in the use of resources.

Consultation and engagement

Leading third sector interests through their engagement with the review of council
grants made a request to "roll over" existing grant awards. Although this was not
granted (report to Committee of 1 October 2013), a modified process for awarding
grants was developed with input from leading third sector interests.

Report

Council Grants to Third Parties 2014/15 – Proposals for Expenditure

1. Background

- 1.1 All Council service areas award grants to either third sector, cultural or sporting bodies, to undertake work which contributes to the achievement of council and Edinburgh Partnership strategic priorities.
- 1.2 A review of how the Council awards grants is now concluded following a report to the Communities and Neighbourhoods Committee earlier this month (and appearing on this committee's agenda today for noting). It was determined that new arrangements will be implemented in the period up to April 2016, and that they will be focussed on ensuring grants are better aligned with council pledge commitments and strategic priorities.
- 1.3 In addition, there will be more focus on prevention, tackling poverty and inequality, and promoting innovation and cooperative working to address projected growth in levels of need and increasing financial pressures. New grant programmes will be taken forward by Executive Committees. As a consequence of this change in arrangements, this will be the last time this committee will be requested to approve the council grants to third parties awards.
- 1.4 In a response to the review, third sector leaders requested that the Council "roll over" existing Council grant awards to 2014/15, meaning that there would be no need for a grant application and award process. This matter was addressed in a report to this committee on 1 October 2013, and although the request was not fully agreed, a revised process of grant application was implemented, which was less onerous to current recipients. This enabled funded organisations to participate more in the review process. However, it should be noted that the normal robust process of assessing applications was maintained.

2. Main report

Grant Recipient Performance Information 2012/13

- 2.1 As in previous years, the performance of grant recipients has been measured.
 119 respondents, each receiving £10,000 or more, submitted performance information which indicates that:
 - in terms of organisations' total income, for every £1 of council investment, over £8 is levered in from other sources;
 - achievement of funding agreement targets remains at 93%, this level has been maintained from previous years;
 - organisational staff hours were around 4.7 million, which is equivalent to 2,500 full time staff;

- volunteers provided 685,000 hours of unpaid service, equivalent to a contribution of over £9m to the Edinburgh economy; and
- customer feedback routinely collected by all organisations indicates satisfaction levels around 80%, which is similar to the previous years.

Grant requests and recommendations 2014/15

- 2.2 Organisations seeking funding for 2014/15 were requested to provide the following information:-
 - level of grant funding sought;
 - proposed SMART outcomes and outputs aligned with service area plans, commissioning plans and other specific investment criteria; and
 - information to enable a financial assessment of the organisation.
- 2.3 Applications have all been subject to rigorous financial and performance assessments.
- 2.4 In total, 218 applications are proposed for awards at a total investment of £23,959,949. A summary is provided in the table below, and more detailed information can be found in appendices one to five. On the basis of unaffordability, a total of four applications are recommended for no award.
- 2.5 Whilst like for like comparison with the awards made in 2013/14 indicates a broadly standstill position, the Committee should note that an additional £995,000 has been included in the recommendations for 2014/15. In the main, this reflects decisions to convert a number of contracts to grants (advice services being the major element). but it also includes a handful of new grants. All these will be met from existing resources.
- 2.6 The following table summarises the overall levels of proposed grant expenditure presented by lead service area:

Future Grant Management Arrangements

- 2.7 The report on the Review of Council Grants to Third parties, approved at the Communities and Neighbourhoods Committee on 11 February 2014, signals a 'gear-change' in grant management arrangements.
- 2.8 Council Executive Committees will now take the lead in developing future grant programmes in partnership with third sector interests, and approving and monitoring awards. New grant programmes will place more focus on prevention, innovation and cooperation, and priorities will be set against new criteria, linked to the Capital Coalition pledge commitments, and service area commissioning plans.
- 2.9 The Committee may also wish to note that an annual report will be presented to the Communities and Neighbourhoods Committee in the autumn of each year, setting out the state of council relations with third sector, cultural and sporting bodies. This report will also identify the total level of council support, social and economic contributions to the city, and importantly, progress with regard to the development of new grant programmes.

3. Recommendations

- 3.1 It is recommended that Committee:-
 - 3.1.1 approve the proposals contained in the report; and
 - 3.1.2 note the potential change in future grant management arrangements as a result of the review of council grants to third parties.

- 1. Two organisations (Partners in Advocacy and Boy's Brigade Edinburgh, Leith & District Battalion) did not apply for 2014-15 and the total allocation of £11,006 will be taken as part of the required departmental saving.
- 2. As indicated in last years grants report, Birthlink is now in a 3 year contract for the statutory Care Connect service. The allocation of £28,415 will no longer be reported through the grants report.
- 3. In the grants report covering 2013-14, an award of £13,528 from Children and Families was reported by Economic Development as part of a larger award. This award was converted into a contract that has been extended to March 2015. The allocation for Smilechildcare from Children and Families is reported here as the allocation still sits within the Children & Families grants budget. It is intended that this budget is allocated for inclusion in the budget available for the affordable childcare co production currently being undertaken by Economic Development and Children and Families.
- 4. Members will be aware of the fire that inflicted major damage on Corstorphine Youth Centre in October 2013. The assessment of the application by Corstorphine Youth Centre has recognised the impact of the fire on the organisation. This will mean that the activity and targets to be included in the funding agreement for 2014-15 are likely to be significantly different to those included in the information supplied by the organisation.
- 5. There was an award of £23,000 made to LAYC under delegated authority for 2013-14. The recommendation here is for the revised total to be continued in 2013-14.
- 6. A second award was also made under delegated authority last year. This was to award the Welcoming Association £10,000 and was in response to the decision of the Corporate Policy and Strategy Committee when considering the Council Grants to Third Parties 2013-14 Proposals for Expenditure report.

Appendix 2

In line with Council Pledges, funding proposals are recommended to ensure continued support for the city's festivals, the key year round cultural venues and for provision of year round cultural activity which targets every ward within the city.

The Council-wide Review of Third Parties has recommended that detailed proposals for new funding programmes are drawn up in consultation with the third sector during the course of 2014/15. Once accepted, all parties will have one year's notice (2015/16) before these new funding programmes are introduced in April 2016. Culture and Sport will take advantage of its update to the Cultural Policy that is currently taking place to make recommendations for new third sector funding programmes from April 2016.

As the majority of cultural grant clients are entering the second year of a three year funding agreement in 2014/15 the timing is right for the adoption of new funding programmes in 2016/17.

2014 will see a number of funded organisations across the arts and sports portfolio focusing on the celebration of the Commonwealth Games and the Year of Homecoming.

As reported last year the Collective Gallery has now relocated to the City Observatory on Calton Hill and partnership working with the Museums Service is well advanced.

A review of the operating model of Theatre Workshop is underway (separately funded by Creative Scotland) and while the award recommended for 2014/15 remains as per 2013/14, funds will be released in tranches to ensure appropriate targets are set for Council investment subject to the outcome of the review.

As instructed by the Council in December 2012 and as reported to Council in November 2013 both the Festival City Theatres Trust and Edinburgh Leisure are now operating under new services and funding agreements. The performance of both Festival City Theatre Trust and Edinburgh Leisure will be reported to the Culture and Sport Committee in due course.

There is also a review underway of the sporting infrastructure across the Council which will inform the funding levels and delivery model for Edinburgh Leisure from 2016/17.

Edinburgh Leisure is recommended to receive £9.6m which includes a £10k award from Health and Social Care. Edinburgh Leisure operates over 50 sport and leisure facilities across the city on behalf of the Council attracting over 4million visits each year. They also undertake extensive project-based work, focusing on hard-to-reach groups and communities. Edinburgh Leisure is the Council's main delivery mechanism for helping the inactive become active, and thereby accruing the quality of life and health benefits that would otherwise remain out of reach for a significant portion of the population.

Employability and Skills in Economic Development has a strategic focus which is outlined in Economic Development's 'Strategy for Jobs'. As part of this focus, Employability and Skills deliver their Third Party Grants programme through 'The Challenge Fund' which is administered by Capital City Partnership. The Challenge Fund encourages employability providers in Edinburgh to pilot new work and develop innovative approaches to specialist provision to meet the strategic objectives of 'Strategy for Jobs. This objectives are to offer employability support to: School Leavers and Young People (14-19 years); those in Low Pay; those in need of Early Intervention; and Support for Regeneration and Vulnerable individuals.

In 2013/14 27 projects were funded by the Challenge Fund. As part of the transition process to allow the Council-wide Third Party review to complete, Employability and Skills conducted a review of all Challenge Fund investments based on performance and strategic fit. A panel with representation from Employability and Skills, Department of Work and Pensions, Skills Development Scotland and also Neighbourhood Partnerships recommended the continuation of funding for all 27 projects for 2014/15 as they have a good strategic fit and are performing within expectations.

Four new applications were also considered by the panel. These were from Cre8te Opportunities Limited who submitted two applications, Digital Skills Academy and Craigmillar Business Incubator Project (CBIP); Self Start Ltd, and Intowork. The recommendation of the panel was to approve two of the applications (The Craigmillar Business Incubator Project (CBIP) and Intowork) and as pilot activity in 2014/15.

H&SC: Health Inequality Strategy

Health inequality is a priority in the Edinburgh Single Outcome Agreement and addresses national outcome 6 and 7. Edinburgh Community Health Partnership's (ECHP) Strategic Framework sets six city objectives and three are priorities for this programme:

- a Ensure a healthy standard of living for all;
- b Create and develop healthy and sustainable places and communities; and
- c Strengthen the role and impact of ill-health prevention.

The partnership has sought the best use of resources in 2014-15 based on a standstill budget despite budget pressures. Applications were assessed on twelve health inequalities outcomes defined to meet the objectives above. Continuing funding has been confirmed for the new priority identified in 2013/14 to address the risks to health and other inequality from the welfare reforms, initially funded with limited resources from the Social Justice Fund and the Corporate Welfare Reform Working Group. This resource will maintain the increased investment in advice services for income maximisation. This contributes to the partnership's objective of "a healthy standard of living for all" as part of wider efforts across the Council to increase these advice resources in all sectors.

A total of 31 applications were assessed against the Health Inequalities criteria by a multi-partner panel formed by the partnership. This assessment process recommended 30 applications totalling £1.5 million with priority for funding against the HI criteria. Due to low achievement against health inequality targets, the partnership recommended that investment from this programme is ended for one application mainly funded through another service.
