Workplace Travel Planning Consultants - Award of Contract

On 23 March 2017, Finance and Resources Committee approved the award of a contract to travel planning consultancy, Sweco, for project delivery in 2017-18. Committee requested an update on the project, including numbers and percentages of people reached.

The table below outlines the impact of travel planning initiatives to date, including numerical and percentage outputs. The 2017-18 project will be similarly monitored as per the monitoring and evaluation plan for SCSP, as approved by grant funders Paths for All.
