4 Annual Efficiency Statement 2008/09

The Scottish Government had required the public sector to meet in-year efficiency targets of 2%, 4% and 6% for each of the three years of the Spending Review 2008/09 to 2010/11. The deadline for submission of Efficiency Statements for 2008/09 to the Convention of Scottish Local Authorities was August 2009.

The Board's first Annual Efficiency Statement 2008/09 was presented. The statement detailed efficiencies achieved in previous years centred around the Best Value Organisational Review and identified areas for projected future efficiency gains.
