Notice of Midlothian Council's Intent to Withdraw from the Minute of Agreement for the Pentland Hills Regional Park

Pentland Hills Regional Park Joint Committee

13th March 2009

Purpose of report

To advise the Joint Committee of Midlothian Council's intent to withdraw from the Joint Minute of Agreement for the Pentland Hills Regional Park.

Main report

- As part of a range of measures in response to current budget pressures, Midlothian Council has taken the decision to withdraw from the Minute of Agreement for the Pentland Hills Regional Park.
- This decision was confirmed in a letter dated 16th January 2009, from Midlothian Council's Director of Commercial Services to the City of Edinburgh Council's Director of Services for Communities, giving notice that Midlothian Council will be withdrawing from the Agreement on 31st March 2010.
- This notice is consistent with paragraph 19 in the Minute of Agreement which requires parties to provide 12 months notice of their intent to withdraw on the 31st March of any given year.

Financial Implications

- The Minute of Agreement requires that any party withdrawing is required to continue making its agreed budget contributions for one further year. This means that the local authority contributions to the Regional Park budget will be unaffected for the coming financial year, 2009-10.
- The decision to withdraw may have significant implications for the management, funding, and staffing of the Regional Park.
- Midlothian Council's Director of Commercial Services has requested that Officers from Midlothian Council and City of Edinburgh Council work to provide a smooth transition during 2009-10. The outcome of these discussions will be reported to the Joint Committee at the earliest opportunity.

Environmental Impact

The current integrated approach to providing a visitor and countryside management service within the Regional Park supports and enhances the high environmental quality and visitor experience. There is a risk that a less integrated approach may reduce service capacity and have a detrimental effect on environmental quality.

Recommendations

- 9 It is recommended that the Joint Committee:
 - a) notes that Midlothian Council has served notice of their intent to withdraw from the joint Minute of Agreement, as of 31st March 2010; and
 - b) notes that officers from Midlothian and City of Edinburgh Council will be discussing transitional arrangements and will report further on these at the next meeting of the Joint Committee.
