

Feedback: year 1 performance



Addressing key transport issues	56.3% - most issues 31.3% - some 12.5% - not at all
Function as a consultative/advisory body	96% - very well/well/OK
Accessing, or participating in, the Transport Forum	87.5% - OK
Changed in perception of Council's coordination of transport network	37.5% - More aware of •range of issues •lack of joining-up
