Item 11.1 – Motion by Cllr Rose – Impact of Road Interventions on Conservation Areas

“Deletes all and replaces with:

1. Notes that the Spaces for People schemes are temporary infrastructure in place to provide safe space for people walking, wheeling and cycling.
2. Notes the recent consultation, with outcomes due to be reported in June 2021 to the Transport and Environment Committee, with options to be agreed.
3. Further notes retaining any safe spaces on a permanent basis does not mean using the temporary infrastructure. Any permanent solutions will require specific Traffic Road Orders which will require additional design and investment in order to be fit for long term purpose, if specific spaces are needed on a permanent basis.
4. Requests that officers take cognisance of existing street design guidance, including where relevant in Conservation Areas, if and when developing any schemes to provide permanent space for walking, wheeling and cycling.”
