1. Committee notes with concern recent reports of violence and unsafe behaviour at Ferryhill Primary School leading to repeated police attendance at the school.
2. Further notes that these concerns have escalated to the extent that the Parent Council have released a statement on the 5th June calling for a “strike” day to draw attention to these concerns.
3. Therefore, calls for officers to urgently engage with the school leadership and parental representatives at Ferryhill Primary School so that these issues do not continue into the new academic year
4. Requests a briefing note to be provided for ward councillors and committee members within two weeks detailing what steps have been taken to reduce tensions and tackle parental concerns alongside a timeline on the reported incidents and actions taken up to this point
