### Item 7.1 - City Plan 2030 Report of Examination and Resolution to Adopt

Adds at end:

Takes the actions above on the clear understanding that due to changes in how Local Development plans are prepared as mandated by the Planning Act 2019, that this is a transitional plan and is not a 10 year plan but only provides a plan until May 2028 when a new form plan will have to be prepared; that the Report of Examination makes clear that 6,371 housing units are unlikely to be delivered during the plan period and has instructed that these sites will be have to reassessed during the preparation of the next Local Development Plan.

## Item 7.1 - City Plan 2030 Report of Examination and Resolution to Adopt

In recommendations, at the end of point 1.1.1, add the words:

", with the exception of the following points:

a) that deletion of the word "walkable" from policy INF 1 is contrary to National Planning Framework 4 (NPF4) policy 15, local living and 20 minute neighbourhoods, and the council therefore does not accept this change, and reverts to the original wording in respect of reporter recommendation 1 of issue 28 – Infrastructure Delivery – Community Facilities.

b) that insertion of the words "all reasonably practicable measures" into policy ENV 8 serves to undermine efforts to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, is contrary to NPF 4 policies 1, 2 and 16, and that the council does not accept this change, and therefore reverts to the original wording in respect of reporter recommendation 4 of issue 13 – Sustainable Design.

c) that insertion of the words "should normally" into policy HOU 2 is contrary to NPF 4 policy 16 e), in that an identified need for affordable homes has been identified in Edinburgh through the housing needs and demand assessment (HoNDA), and therefore agrees not to accept the reporter's recommendation 1 of issue 23 – Affordable Housing."
