Executive Summary

The City of Edinburgh Council has been notified of a parade which is proposed to take place in December 2019.

The Council has limited powers in respect of parades. It can take no action and the parades would proceed as the organisers intend. Alternatively, it has the power to attach conditions or, under limited circumstances, to ban the parades. The Committee needs to decide whether to exercise any of these options.

In January 2018 the Regulatory Committee decided to continue the practice that all parades involving the High Street must be submitted for Committee consideration.

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Report

Proposed Parade/Procession: December 2019

1. Recommendations

1.1 It is recommended that the committee makes an order in respect of the proposed parade, imposing conditions attached at Appendix 2.

2. Background

- 2.1 Under the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982, anyone organising a parade or procession in Scotland must notify the appropriate local authority and the police at least 28 days prior to the date of the event.
- 2.2 The City of Edinburgh Council has been notified of intent to hold the Torchlight Procession in the city (further details in Appendix 1). It is proposed that the parade will use the High Street.
- 2.3 The Council has limited powers available regarding the control of such parades. These powers should only normally be exercised to prevent public disorder, risk to public safety, damage to property or excessive disruption to the life of the community.

3. Main report

- 3.1 Notification form and other documents relevant to the proposed parade are attached as Appendix 1.
- 3.2 The recommended conditions (Appendix 2) are sufficient to mitigate and manage any possible disruption to the community.
- 3.3 A representative of the organisation will be invited to address the committee regarding the proposed parade.

4. Measures of success

- 4.1 That the Council discharges its statutory duties in respect of these notifications.
- 4.2 That any parade is facilitated wherever possible and is managed in a way that minimises potential disruption to the life of the community.

5. Financial impact

- 5.1 None arising directly from this report.
- 5.2 Council resources may need to be deployed on the day, in particular with respect to any road closures.

6. Risk, policy, compliance and governance impact

6.1 Should the committee decide to restrict or prohibit the procession, the person proposing to hold the procession may appeal against that decision to the Sheriff Court within 14 days of written reasons being received by them.

7. Equalities impact

7.1 In coming to a decision, the committee will have to consider the rights of the procession organisers to stage their procession, and the Council's duty to foster good relations and ensure the protection of public order and safety. These must be discharged against the relevant statutory duties.

Executive Summary

Mr Woodford is an ice cream seller whose street trading activities appear to be causing nuisance and annoyance to neighbouring residents. Concerns have also been raised regarding his business affecting the safety of pedestrians and other road users. The location is opposite Holy Rood High School and at lunchtimes is attracting significant numbers of pupils around his van.

It is therefore requested that the Licensing Sub Committee considers applying an additional licensing condition identifying street locations near Holy Rood High School where Mr Woodford should not trade.



Report

Street Trader Application - David Woodford

1. Recommendations

- 1.1 After hearing from the Council Officers and relevant licence holder, it is recommended that the committee:
 - 1.1.1 attaches an additional licensing condition restricting Mr Woodford's trading and preventing him from trading from the street locations near Holy Rood High School (Appendix 1).

2. Background

2.1 The Police and other persons can make comments or complaints about applications for various licences. Committee members can consider such comments and requests. They can decide to take no further action, issue a warning to the licence holder, suspend the licence or revoke the licence.

3. Main report

- 3.1 David Woodford was the holder of a Street Trader's Licence with the City of Edinburgh Council. The street trading activity for which Mr Woodford was licensed is the sale of ice cream, minerals and confectionary from his mobile unit. His last licence expired on 13 August 2019. A renewal licence application was received on 12 August 2019, however this was not accompanied by the appropriate payment and his cheque was unsigned. As a result, his renewal was late and the licence lapsed. Mr Woodford has now made the appropriate payment and his application is being processed as a new licence application.
- 3.2 The Zones from Mr Woodford was licensed to operate are Zones 4 and 5. Details of the specified Zones for street trading are attached as Appendix 2.
- 3.3 As an ice cream seller Mr Woodford must comply with the standard conditions of licence for street traders. These include:
 - 3.3.1 Condition 2: The licence holder shall not carry on business on any street as to unreasonably obstruct road users or affect their safety; and
 - 3.3.2 Condition 5: The licence holder shall on all occasions, when carrying on business, behave in a proper and civil manner, and not carry on business in such a way as to cause a nuisance or annoyance to any person.

- 3.4 In March 2019, a complaint was received by the Directorate alleging that Mr Woodford was causing nuisance and annoyance to residents close to Holy Rood High School, 55 Duddingston Road West, while selling goods from his mobile unit during the lunch period of the school.
- 3.5 An officer from the Licensing Enforcement Team visited the area on 18 March 2019 and found Mr Woodford operating from Meadowfield Drive. He was spoken to, advised of the complaint and reminded of his licence conditions. It was agreed after this discussion that Mr Woodford would move to another location.
- 3.6 A further complaint was received on 20 March 2019. This complaint concerned the location at 78 Duddingston Road West from which Mr Woodford was now trading. The complainant, who lives in proximity to this location, alleged that when operating from this location Mr Woodford was causing nuisance and annoyance to residents, as the school children were blocking the pavement and the entrance to homes. It is alleged that litter was also being dropped and placed into residents' hedges. Concerns were also raised for the school children's safety, as the location is on a main bus route.
- 3.7 On 21 March 2019 Mr Woodford was again visited by an officer from the Licensing Enforcement team. He was again reminded that the new location was also one about which complaints had been received. During the discussions he was made aware of nature of the complaints and advised that he should move to a location which would not cause annoyance or nuisance to any residents.
- 3.8 Despite several visits and follow-up discussions with officers, Mr Woodford has continued to trade from the location on Duddingston Road West. Because of this the matter is now being brought before the Licensing Sub Committee for its consideration when Mr Woodford's new licence is being determined.
- 3.9 Officers request that an additional licence condition should be attached, restricting the locations in the vicinity of Holy Rood High School from which the Licence holder is permitted to trade (Appendix 1). This should address the concerns described above.

4. Measures of success

4.1 Not relevant, as decisions on individual licences have to be considered on their own merits.

5. Financial impact

6.2 The applicant has a right of appeal against any decision made. The appeal lies to the Sheriff Court
