Executive Summary

The Council has received a request on behalf of the organisers of Edinburgh Farmers' Market at Castle Terrace to agree to accept a reduced application fee for a Market Operator Licence.

A fee reduction is sought on the basis of points made in the applicant's letter (Appendix 1).



Report

Request for Fee Refund – Market Operator Licence – Edinburgh Farmers' Market

1. Recommendations

- 1.1 It is recommended that the Committee:
 - 1.1.1 notes the terms of the request; and
 - 1.1.2 refuses the request.

2. Background

- 2.1 The Edinburgh Farmers' Market Cooperative Committee has requested that the application fees due for the required Market Operator Licence should be reduced.
- 2.2 The Council agreed that the fees charged for licence applications with effect from 1 April 2018 shall remain unchanged.
- 2.3 Historically, fee reductions or refunds for large events have only been granted if the organiser is a charity or a community group. The cooperative is a community based collective but not a charity.
- 2.4 On 21 February 2019 the Council agreed to adopt a policy of full cost recovery for major events in the city delivered by third parties. It was agreed to increase cost recovery through charges levied for licensing and regulatory services, road occupation licences and consents, where permitted by legislation.
- 2.5 As previously reported to Regulatory Committee in November 2020, at a meeting of the Policy and Sustainability Committee on 20 August 2020 the Council agreed not to offer further deferral of licensing fees. The Committee was provided information regarding the financial impact of the public health emergency on licensing income.

3. Main report

- 3.1 The Edinburgh Farmers' Market Cooperative Committee has submitted a written request (Appendix 1), seeking that the application fee due for a Market Operator Licence at Castle Terrace should be reduced. A copy of the relevant correspondence is attached to this report at Appendix 2.
- 3.2 The fee structure for 2020/2021 was agreed with effect from 1 April 2018. As this location falls in the city centre, the fee due for the market with 40 stalls is £3,520 (40 x £88).

- 3.3 If the Committee is minded to grant a fee reduction, it is requested that it is made clear to the applicant that this level of fee reduction cannot be sustained, as the cost is being met by other licence holders through their payment of fees, and that the applicant should plan their budget in future years accordingly.
- 3.4 The Council incurs significant costs in dealing with issues arising from licensed premises in the city. These costs are required to be directly recovered from licence fees.
- 3.5 A representative of the applicant will be invited to address the Committee on the request for the fee reduction.

4 Measures of success

4.1 The premises are licensed in a proportionate and effective manner.

5 Financial impact

- 5.1 The Council's scale of fees for licensing applications was approved with effect from 1 April 2018. Any reduced fee would be required to be absorbed by the licensing budget for 2020/21.
- 5.2 The Regulatory Committee was provided an update on the impact of the public health emergency in a report in November 2020. A link to that report is included below in the 'Background' section.

6 Risk, policy, compliance and governance impact

- 6.1 The fee structure was agreed by full Council. Any reduction risks setting a precedent. However, the Committee has discretion in this matter.
- 6.2 Should the fees be waived or reduced it is likely other licence holders will seek a similar reduction and this may negatively impact the Council's overall financial position.

Applications for the grant of House in Multiple Occupation ('HMO') Licences have been received for five properties at 4-5 Parliament Street, Edinburgh. These properties are used by the Council as supported homeless accommodation, and this would normally be a routine application.

These properties have previously been licensed but the licences have lapsed during the lockdown period. The applications are therefore applications for new licences, and the applicants request an exemption from policy in order to allow the accommodation to continue to operate. The report sets out relevant sections of the policy background which should be considered when determining these applications.

Applications for Grant of House in Multiple Occupation Licences – 4-5 Parliament Street

1. Recommendations

- 1.1 It is recommended that the committee:
 - 1.1.1 notes the contents of this report; and
 - 1.1.2 grants the applications and the requests for exemption, and attaches standard conditions to the licences.

2. Background

- 2.1 The requirement to hold a House in Multiple Occupation ('HMO') Licence is set out in the Housing (Scotland) Act 2006 ('the Act'). The procedures for processing such applications and considering objections etc. are set out in the Act.
- 2.2 The committee can add other reasonable conditions as it sees fit, if it is minded to grant the licences.

3. Main report

- 3.1 Applications for the grant of HMO Licences for five properties have been received from Dunedin Canmore Housing Ltd. These properties have previously been licensed by the Council as HMOs for many years. The licences were allowed to lapse during the lockdown period, and therefore the applications must now be dealt with as new applications,
- 3.2 These properties are used by the Council as supported homeless accommodation and have been licensed as HMOs for several years. Historically the Council has granted these licences with some exemptions to the physical standards requirements for HMOs. The points in question are considered by the Directorate to be relatively minor, for example work surfaces in kitchens or room sizes being slightly smaller than the required standards. The properties have operated satisfactorily for a number of years, providing the Council with important accommodation for homelessness services.
- 3.3 The properties have been inspected by Council officers regarding their suitability for use as HMOs. Nonconformities are highlighted in Appendix 1. It is recommended

that the Committee grants these licences with exemptions as sought, on the basis that the use of the accommodation is temporary in nature and it would not be proportionate to insist on modifications to bring these properties in line with current physical specification.

- 3.4 Officers have no concerns about this application, and had it been a renewal application it would normally be granted under delegated powers.
- 3.5 The applicants request an exemption from policy in order to allow the accommodation to continue to operate. The applicant or his representative have been invited to address the committee
- 3.6 After hearing from Executive Director of Place or his representative regarding this report., it is recommended that members of the committee then hear from the applicant.
