Committee notes:

It was regretful that at the Regulatory Committee on 31 March 2022, despite the legal advice given to Committee which they did not heed, and the risk of the Council being taken to a Judicial Review, the Labour Group along with their Conservative colleagues, voted against Sexual Entertainment Venues in Edinburgh. Additionally, neither Labour nor Conservative Councillors gave any thought for the consequences this vote would have on those working in this industry.

The Judicial Review held on 10 February 2023 found against the Council and as a result, the cost for defending this decision amounted to circa £117.000, money that could have been spent on Council services.

Committee is asked to thank officers for the great deal of additional work they undertook as a result of defending a case which was doomed to be a failure.
