This<br>effect is exacerbated by prevailing wind<br>conditions, leading to nitrogen dioxide (NO2)<br>concentrations that are around 34% higher<br>on the south side, as CEC's passive<br>diffusion tube measurements show. The<br>expert noted stationary cars keep the traffic<br>away from the shop fronts, creating a space<br>in which NO2 dilutes naturally. Dundee City<br>Council recently moved traffic one lane from<br>homes to reduce pollution in this way.<br>John points out the CCWEL will remove the<br>parking bays (and the natural dilution zone),<br>thus moving westbound traffic 3m closer to<br>the shopfronts. The lane of traffic waiting to<br>turn right will move into the southern half of<br>the Terrace. The combination of these<br>factors may lead to a breach of the limit set<br>in the Air Quality Standards (Scotland)<br>Regulations 2010. High levels can lead to<br>asthma, coronary heart disease, stroke, lung<br>cancer, miscarriages and COPD<br>The impact of the planned changes on air<br>quality and health should be assessed by a<br>suitably qualified expert, using an approved<br>dispersion modelling tool that can model the | Corstorphine /<br>Murrayfield |
