Proposed changes to the Committees' Terms of Reference

Edinburgh Integration Joint Board

Executive Summary	The purpose of this report is to provide the Edinburgh Integration Joint Board (EIJB) with an update on the review of scrutiny of delegated services, which the EIJB agreed to undertake at its meeting on the 9 February 2024.	
Recommendations	 It is recommended that the Edinburgh Integration Joint Board: Note that a review of where scrutiny of delegated services is currently undertaken has been completed. Agrees that the EIJB takes the overall responsibility and accountability for the scrutiny of delegated services. 	
	3. Agrees the changes to the terms of reference of each of the committees as detailed in Appendix 1. These changes will ensure robust scrutiny of delegated services is undertaken through the EIJB and will provide assurance to partners.

Report Circulation

- 1. This report has not been circulated elsewhere before being presented to the Edinburgh Integration Joint Board (EIJB) for consideration.
- There have been several reports to the City of Edinburgh Council (the Council) <u>Policy</u> <u>and Sustainability Committee</u>, <u>Finance and Resources Committee</u> and <u>EIJB</u> detailing a range of workstreams to address the <u>Full Party Motion to Full Council on 2 November</u> <u>2023.</u>

Main Report

- 3. Integration Joint Boards (IJBs) were established in 2014, under the Public Bodies (Joint Working) Scotland Act 2014 (the Act). The Act sets out the legislative framework for integrating health and social care services. IJB's are responsible for setting the strategy and planning for health and social care services. They should use the totality of delegated budgets to deliver more joined up, community-based health and social care services. The Integration Scheme is legally binding and sets out the powers delegated to IJB's and includes the governance and financial arrangements all parties (e.g. NHS Lothian and the Council) should adhere to.
- 4. The integration scheme between the City of Edinburgh Council (the Council) and NHS Lothian states that the EIJB would be primarily responsible for delivery, capacity, and performance management for delegated services, recognising that the EIJB is the only body that would undertake scrutiny across both CEC and NHS Lothian.
- 5. Within the Integration Scheme, all voting board members will be expected to have due regard to the interests of NHS Lothian / City of Edinburgh Council, by on the understanding that in carrying out their role as a member of the EIJB, their primary duties and responsibilities are those which attach in the capacity. In summary, when acting as an IJB member, they should make decisions in the best interests of the EIJB.
- 6. The All-Party Motion highlighted several areas that Elected Members felt further work was needed. The EIJB also agreed several actions at its meeting on the 9 February and is undernoted:

- 7. Since the meeting on the 9 February, officers have reviewed the current scrutiny and governance arrangements across delegated services. It is acknowledged that scrutiny of delegated services is occurring within the EIJB and its committee structure alongside NHS Lothian Healthcare Governance Committee, Council Policy and Sustainability Committee, Governance Risk and Best Value Committee and Finance and Resources Committee. This means that scrutiny is currently fragmented and no one organisation is overseeing the scrutiny of all delegated services. There are also gaps in the level of scrutiny that is undertaken on health and social care services which requires to be covered.
- 8. Therefore, this report proposes that the EIJB takes the overall responsibility and accountability for the scrutiny of delegated services. The rationale for this approach is that:
 - a. Under the Integration Scheme, the EIJB have responsibility for the delivery, capacity, and performance management for delegated services.
 - b. The EIJB have a responsibility to ensure that the services they direct partners to deliver is being delivered in line with the financial budgets and key performance indicators specified within the direction.
 - c. It is best practice that the body that sets the strategic direction also monitors the implementation of that strategy.
 - d. The EIJB are the only body, that has oversight of both of health and social care delegated services.



- 9. The level of scrutiny is also important. The Chief Officer has operational responsibility for delegated services within the Edinburgh Health and Social Care Partnership. The EIJB is also predominately a strategic body that does not make operational decisions. However, there is a need for increased scrutiny of the outcomes and delivery of delegated services, to ensure those services are delivered efficiently and are meeting the needs of the people of Edinburgh. This also provides a clear link between strategy, policy, and delivery.
- 10. To allow for this change in approach, only minor amendments are required to the EIJB committee terms of reference to allow the EIJB to undertake robust scrutiny and monitor the performance of delegated services as specified within the Integration Scheme. Appendix 1 provides a list of core functions, where these should be reported to within the existing EIJB governance arrangements and highlights what changes are required to the EIJB committees' terms of reference to facilitate these arrangements. The change of approach will require a greater focus on scrutiny of services by the EIJB's committees.
- 11. It is proposed that the Chief Officer provides a report to the relevant partners governance committees providing assurance that appropriate scrutiny is being undertaken.

Implications for Edinburgh Integration Joint Board

Financial

12. There are no direct financial implications arising from this report. The details contained within the report are enhancing the existing governance arrangements.

Legal / risk implications

13. There are no direct legal implications arising from this report. Enhancing the EIJB governance structures will mitigate the risk that governance systems are not robust or do not function as expected.

Equality and integrated impact assessment

14. The proposals contained within appendix 1 of this report are minor in that, there are minor changes to terms specified within the committee terms of reference, a integrated impact assessment is not required at this stage.

Environment and sustainability impacts

15. There are no environmental or sustainability impacts arising from this report.



Quality of care

16. There are no direct impacts arising from the proposal contained within this report.

Consultation

17. There has been engagement with the chairs of each of the committees in terms of the proposed minor changes to the terms of reference for committees and they have indicated they are satisfied with the proposals contained within appendix 1.
