As well as being visible as a vertical column from the street scape and buildings of Great Stuart Street, Palmerston Place, Drumsheugh Gardens, Drumsheugh Place, Queensferry Street, The Caledonian hotel windows and entrance, Lyndoch Place, The Dean Bridge, as well as Randolph Crescent particularly in the Spring, Autumn and Winter for 6 months of the year when there are no leaves on the trees.
2. It is out of scale and proportion to the surrounding grade A listed buildings and their setting.
3. There would be adverse impact on views and site lines through, into and out of the City setting and streetscape and World Heritage Site.

Contravenes the management plan of the World Heritage site. Following the disgraceful mishap when masts were recently erected in contravention of planning law on the Yotel roof at 68 Queen Street because the City planning department had not asked advice from Historic Environment Scotland, HES, which it was obliged to do. The masts on 68 Queen Street would not have been allowed had their advice been sought.

Advice must be asked in this case from HES as to whether this mast is allowed to be erected in a Conservation area, and the surrounds of a World Heritage site.

## Height of the Mast

At a height of 20 metres the mast will tower way above the line of the trees in Randolph Crescent Garden and will have a detrimental effect on the character of the garden and is totally out of keeping with a World Heritage Site and Conservation Area.

## Potential Detriment to Health

Inadequate research has been carried out so far regarding the potential detrimental effects of 5G networks on human health. There are concerns particularly "that exposures can produce wide-ranging effects, including reproductive, foetal, oncological, neuropsychiatric, skin, eye and immunological" - see article by Professor John William Frank, Usher Institute, Edinburgh University in the BMJ 18/01/2021

### EMF and Dysbiosis

In a healthy intestinal tract our "good" bacteria function in a cooperative relationship with each other and in harmony with our body. They help our digestion, immune system, food absorption and elimination. An imbalance of the bacterial strains in the gut, also called dysbiosis, can cause various problems due to the resulting digestion and immune function problems. In addition, E. coli bacteria became more resistant to antibiotics after EMF exposure and their rapid growth caused a biofilm to form in a very short time (7). Other good bacteria that have been studied in relation to EMF radiation are Lactobacillus bacteria. They are among the many good bacteria that naturally exist in our intestinal tract and are also widely available as probiotics.

Good bacteria prevent microbes (pathogens) from passing through the intestinal membrane and thus prevent them to move freely throughout the body. Various Lactobacillus bacteria are also known to improve allergies, heal gastrointestinal disorders and boost immunity.

Unfortunately, however, these same good bacteria are highly susceptible to the harmful effects of EMF. In 2016, two Indian researchers conducted a study to understand the effects of EMF on Lactobacillus bacteria.
