### 1 Deputation – Liberton and District Community Council

The deputation asked the Council to consider:

- retaining the name of Liberton and District Community Council as they felt it
  indicated the inclusion of new estates, and considered the proposed name of
  Liberton, Gracemount and Inch Community Council to be exclusive rather
  than inclusive as it added only two of the areas within the community council
  area.
- additional time to present an alternative proposal during the final four week consultation period on revised boundaries as both Liberton and District and Gilmerton and Inch Community Councils felt that that the current proposals would not deliver an equitable population balance.
- changing the registration procedure for the appointment of nominated representatives, as they felt it deterred local interest groups, and suggested the removal of the requirement that groups should be constituted for over a year, that they must re-register before each election, and that they must be of benefit to the wider public beyond their members.

# 2 Review of Scheme for Community Councils and their Boundaries

Details were provided on the outcome of the first statutory consultation period of ten weeks for the Review of the Scheme and Boundaries for Community Councils and endorsement sought for an eight-week consultation period to comply with legislation.

### Motion
